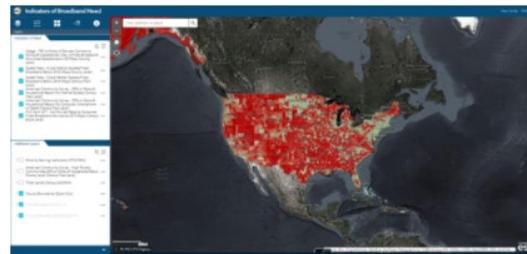


# Broadband Planning Resources for Local Governments

## 1 Indicators of Broadband Need Map

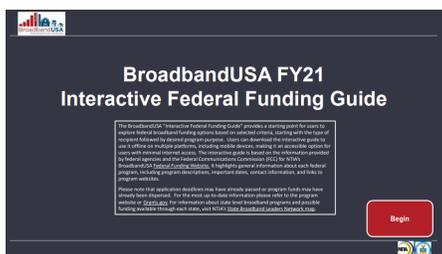
The [Indicators of Broadband Need map](#) is an interactive tool that allows users to explore various datasets and see areas across the country that lack access to high-quality internet.



The map uses public and private data to show broadband availability on county, census tract, and census block levels. Layers in this map were created using data sourced from the American Community Survey collected by the U.S. Census, Ookla, Measurement Lab (M-Lab), Microsoft, and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

**How Can This Help My Community?** The map can help you plan *how* and *where* to improve broadband services for your community. The data can also be used to help policymakers make informed decisions to expand broadband access and close the digital divide.

## 2 Interactive Federal Funding Guide



NTIA's [Interactive Federal Funding Guide](#) provides a step-by-step format which filters through more than 90 broadband-related programs compiled from 12 federal agencies and the Federal Communications Commission. It highlights key information about each program, including program descriptions, important dates, contact information, and links to program websites.
