Projects funding by the ICDBG program must principally benefit low-and moderate-income persons (24 CFR 1003.208). The program regulations provide for categories of grants, Single Purpose and Imminent Threat: Housing rehabilitation, is acquisition to support new housing construction, and under limited circumstances, is housing construction. Community Facilities Infrastructure construction, e.g., roads, and sewer facilities; and, single or multipurpose community buildings. Economic Development Wide variety of commercial, industrial, agricultural projects which may recipient owned and operated or which may be owned and/or operated by a third particultural projects.
